

He was jailed for 12 months for burglary.

to enter a building and steal things *I think we've been burgled!*

2.3 **kill** (v) $\star\star\star$ /kil/

töten / umbringen

to make a person or other living thing die *Each year thousands of people are killed and injured on the roads.*

2.4 **mug** (v) /mʌɡ/

(in der Öffentlichkeit) überfallen / ausrauben to attack someone in a public place and steal their money or possessions

They were mugged just in front of their house.

2.5 **mugging** (n) /magin/

(öffentlicher) Überfall / Raub

an attack on someone in a public place in order to steal their money, jewellery, or other possessions

2.6 **murder** (n) $\star\star$ /'m3x(r)də(r)/

Mord

the crime of deliberately killing someone The murder was committed over five years ago.

2.7 **piracy** (n) /'paɪrəsi/

1 Produktpiraterie

the crime of making and selling illegal copies of computer programs, books, videos, or CDs *The authorities have recently cracked down on software piracy*.

the crime of stealing things from ships while they are sailing

There is a great deal of piracy in the ocean around Africa.

someone who steals things from ships while they are sailing

2.9 **rob** (v) /rob/

rauben

to take money or property from someone illegally *They were planning to rob the museum.*

2.10 **robbery** (n) /'rɒbəri/

Rauh

the crime of stealing money or property $a\ bank\ robbery$

2.11 shoplifting (n) /'sppliftin/

Ladendiebstahl

the crime of stealing things from a shop

2.12 **steal** (v) $\star\star$ /stirl/

stehlen

to take something that belongs to someone else without permission

She was caught stealing food from the supermarket.

the crime of stealing something *There have been a lot of thefts recently.*
