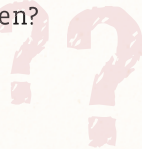
In Großbritannien unterscheidet man bis zu sechs Mahlzeiten: Der Tag beginnt mit einem **breakfast** – meist nur eine kleine Mahlzeit wie *toast* oder *cereals*. Das traditionelle *English Breakfast* mit mehreren Gängen und warmen Zutaten findet man nicht mehr so oft. Gegen elf Uhr gibt es eine Zwischenmahlzeit, die **eleveneses**: eine Tasse Tee (*cuppa*) und ein Gebäckstück. Als **lunch** reicht vielen ein belegtes *sandwich*. Beliebte Varianten sind z. B. *BLT* (Schinken, Salat, Tomate) und *corned beef* (gepökelt Rindfleisch). Zum traditionellen **five o'clock tea** gehören ein Stück Kuchen oder *scones*, süße Brötchen mit *jam* oder *marmalade*. Am Abend gibt es **dinner**: eine große warme Mahlzeit, z. B. *chicken pie*, *potatoes and vegetables*. Als **supper** wird in manchen Gegenden eine kleine Mahlzeit vor dem Zubettgehen bezeichnet, in anderen versteht man darunter ein leichtes Abendessen.

A visit to Britain isn't complete without a visit to the local pub! Find out why:



The history¹ of the British Pub
 From about² 1500, when people went from one town³ to another town, they often stayed in *pubs* (or *public houses*) over night, so a pub was like a hotel. Today you can't sleep⁴ in pubs, but you can have drinks there, and often also very good food. Pubs often have traditional names: *The King's Arms*, *The Bull's Head*, *The Prince of Wales* or *The White Lion*.

British Pub Food
 You can find the best pub food in *gastropubs*. They have really good and fresh meals. You can have traditional British meals like *Steak Pie*, *Fish and Chips* or a *Curry* – and of course on Sundays you can eat *Roast Beef* and *Yorkshire Pudding*!
 In gastropubs you can order food at the table, but in other pubs you order your food at the bar.
 Don't forget⁵: You order your drinks at the bar in *all* British pubs, and you pay for them when you order.

The British Pub Quiz
 In 2012 there were about 51,000 pubs in the UK – and there are more than 22,000 pub quizzes every week! The quiz trend started in the 1970s. You play in teams of 4–8 people. There are questions about sport, films, history, culture ... and there is normally a prize. The teams can win free drinks or a pub meal. A quizmaster asks the questions. The team works together to find the answer, without mobile phones of course! The pub quiz is an important part⁶ of British pub culture – and it's fun too!
